



**COLONEL DAVID A. WARNICK**

Upon graduation from the United States Military Academy in 1993, COL David A. Warnick was commissioned as an Aviation Officer in the United States Army. His initial assignment was to Fort Rucker, AL where he completed initial entry rotary wing training and an advanced aircraft transition to the Kiowa Warrior. He was then assigned to F Troop 5-17th Cavalry Squadron Camp Stanton, South Korea as the Executive Officer for an Aviation Unit Maintenance Troop. Following this assignment he completed the Aviation Maintenance Managers Course and Aviation Officers Advanced Course prior to being assigned to Fort Drum, NY. While at Fort Drum, David served as an Assistant Operations Officer and commanded D Troop 3-17th Cavalry.

David was next assigned as the Battalion Operations Officer of 2/347th Regiment of the 5th Training Support Brigade located at Fort Gordon, Ga. During this assignment he was assessed into the Acquisition Corps and received orders for Redstone Arsenal in Huntsville, AL. In this first acquisition assignment, COL Warnick served as an assistant program manager in both the Aviation Rockets and Missiles Product Office and the Close Combat Weapons Systems Project Office within PEO Missiles and Space.

COL Warnick then attended the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, CA where he earned a MBA in Systems Acquisition Management. After receiving his degree, David was again assigned to Fort Drum, NY where he served as the Team Leader for the 605th Senior Contingency Contacting Team as a warranted contracting officer.

Following his assignment to Fort Drum, David was on the Department of the Army Staff in Washington D.C. During this assignment he served as a Systems Coordinator (DASC) and as the Executive Officer for the Deputy of Acquisition and Systems Management in ASA(ALT).

David then returned to PEO Missiles and Space where he served as the Product Manager for HELLFIRE Missile Systems responsible for the life-cycle management of all missile systems, launchers and associated test and training equipment. After completing his command, David attended the Air War College in Montgomery Alabama where he earned a Masters in Strategic Studies. COL Warnick then went on to serve as the Executive Officer to the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Acquisition, Logistics and Technology.

COL Warnick's awards and decorations include, the Meritorious Service Medal with 4 Oak Leaf Clusters, the Army Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, and the Army Aviation Badge.
